
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SA Tomorrow Background

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The Challenge: Expected Growth



This means ¹/₂ million new housing units and ¹/₂ million new jobs.



Comprehensive Plan

Adopted in 2016, the SA Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan is the overarching planning document that sets the long-term policy direction for growth and development in the City over the next 20 to 25 years.

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SA Tomorrow Sub-Area Plans



Sub-area Planning

- Method of implementation for the SA Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan
- Effective and equitable planning for the entire city
- Consists of regional center plans (major activity and employment centers) and community area plans (higher concentration of residential uses) for smaller geographic areas of the City
- Uniquely tailored to the needs of each sub-۲ area to guide growth and development in detail
- Create a comprehensive and consistent land use map for the entire city
- Completed in five phases, with six sub-area ulletplans in each phase




A History of the Southeast Area

The history of San Antonio's Southeast Community Area tells the story of the City's gradual expansion, through waves of annexation, starting in th early 1900s within the original 36 square mile City limits. There are a number of neighborhoods in the Southeast Community, some that bec ent as early as the 1910s, as well as subdivisions that are ing constructed. The area was originally settled by Silesia Czech. Polish, and Belgian farmers and ranchers by the late 1800s Previously farmland and pasture, the earliest neighborhood in the Southeast Community was the Highland Park, which was develope etween 1910 and 1945. Between 1944 and 1957, the City began to expand and the Southeast Community continued to grow further eastware with the annexations of the Pasadena Heights. Comanche Commun


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Sub-Area Plans

- Regional Centers
 - Major activity and employment centers
 - 50% of new jobs
 - 20% of new households
 - Currently or will have a total employment of at least 15,000 jobs
 - Areas to concentrate higher density mixed uses
- Community Area Plans
 - Areas not within a regional center
 - Generally includes 5 to 11 neighborhoods
 - Not as intense in employment concentration
 - Support Regional Centers and provide workforce



 - Texas A&M San Antonio
 - NE I-35 and Loop 410
- Community Area Plans
 - Southeast
 - Near Eastside
- Kick-off date: January 2019
- Anticipated completion: mid-2020









- Integrate applicable recommendations from previous plans into subject matter sections of the Sub-Area Plan.

 - Address Near-, Medium-, and Long-Term projects and programs
 - Guide:
 - City investments and projects (require funding, planning, design and construction)
 - Private investment (require financing, design, approvals and construction)
- Have a 10-year horizon and to be updated accordingly
